

Timeline & information compiled by Christian King

1816

Land now known as Erf 10 (roughly bordered by streets Church, Hermon, Piet Retief and Kloof) surveyed.

1867

DR Church takes ownership of Erf 10 (Title Deed: T127/1867)

1874

DR Church takes ownership of Erf 215 (Morestêr)

1920

Erf 216 (Indicated as "Location" – a popular name for non-white areas in the 20th century – on the Surveyor General diagram) deducted from Erf 215.

1924

Erf 201: DR Church to DR Mission Church (See Red line report for Erf 201 – 1924). The position and shape of the Mission Church is indicated on both the Erf 201 diagram, as well as the red line report.

1927

Erf 201: DR Mission Church to DR Church (see diagram Erf 201 – 1924 with subsequent annotations)

1957

Group Areas Act (Riebeek Kasteel Land Claims doc)

1958 & 1959

Arrival of the Vloks and du Toits (Estate websites) Adriaan Johannes Vlok buys Erf 215 (Title Deed: T10353/1958) and (T14518/1959) from the DR Church.

1959 – 29 June

Surveyor General approves the new layout (on which current erven are based) of "Riebeek Kasteel – Extension 1" situated on the half of Oukloof within the current urban edge (Erf 333). Erf 201 remains as an erf.

1962

DR Church still has ownership of Erf 333 (Remaining portion of Erf 10 – See 1816) (T6593/1962)

1965

Forced removals at Oukloof (A price on the past – Anna Bohlin)

1969

Adriaan (Attie) Vlok buys Erf 216 (The part of Oukloof that is now vineyards) (T20357/1969)

1971

Christoffel Rust buys Erf 201 (Erf with old mission church) (T29223/1971)

1984

Erf 201 subdivided into Erf 201 and Erf 564

1985

Daniel Euvrard buys Erf 564 (T4406/1985)

1988

Catharina Roux buys Erf 201 (T54198/1988)

Johan Vlok buys Erf 201 (T69493/1988)

1992

Johan Vlok buys Erf 564 (T64937/1992)
